Hof Kasselmann in Hagen a.T.W. • April 22 to 26, 2015

The young savages in top form

(Hagen a.T.W.) The young riders were in top form on the second day of Horses & Dreams meets Australia, dominating almost all disciplines and tests. "Hagen is a horse show that regularly invites young talents to compete there, too," discipline trainer Heinrich-Hermann Engemann explained. He is responsible for the German show jumping futurity squad. The 25-year old Jan Wernke and his Holstein mare Queen Mary won the CSI4*-jumper class, prize of the Hof Kasselmann KG. "I spent a great deal of time thinking whether I should already ride that fast today, but now I know what I've got," the rider from Holdorf said with a smile.

Wernke rode the bay Holstein mare in faultless 65.86 seconds to victory. "It was quite important for me to perform as good as possible here today with Queen Mary. She had a longer break, and this is now a perfect start into the new season," the young rider happily said about his successful debut. Wernke is now looking forward to more excellent rounds in Hagen and to the qualifier for the Hagen Grand Prix, the first stage of the DKB-Riders Tour on Sunday. David Will from Pfungstadt and Lesthago finished second, followed by the New Zealander Bruce Goodin in the saddle of Centina.

And the young four-legged futurity prospects of the experienced show jumping elite

competed in the first qualifier of the Youngster Tour for seven- and eight-year-old horses in the show jumping stadium at the Borgberg. International show jumping stars such as Billy Twomey (IRL), Marcus Ehning, Mario Stevens as well as the family clan of Robert, John and Michael Whitaker (GBR) entered the competition and participated at the prize of the company dietz blumen & events.

However, the seven-year-old Cavino Q, a Vingino-Monaco-son from the Dutch breed, won this test, ridden by the Latvian Kristaps Neretnieks. Second place went to the also seven-year-old Catoki-Acordplus-daughter Catch me if you can under the only 20-year-old Laura Klaphake. Third came in Inliner, an eight-year-old stallion by Iberio out of a Sao Paulo-dam, standing with the Celle National State Stud and ridden by Eva Bitter.

The 24-year-old Katrin Eckermann already demonstrated all her qualities in the early morning in the two-phase jumper class, qualifier for the medium tour. She won with the Lord Z-progeny Carlsberg, followed by the Mexican Santiago Lambre with Zeus du Buisson Z and Tim Rieskamp-Goedeking with Quartz.
